

APR DRG Frequently Asked Questions



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1. What is APR-DRG?

It is a prospective payment system that classifies hospital discharges based on diagnosis, procedures performed, severity of illness, and risk of mortality.

2. Why is it being implemented in Puerto Rico?

PRHIA (ASES) aims to align the hospital payment system with federal standards and improve efficiency, transparency, and equity.

3. How is the payment calculated?

The payment per hospital discharge is calculated as follows: DRG Base Payment = Hospital Base Rate × DRG Relative Weight

4. What benefits does it offer?

- More objective compensation based on resources used.
- Reduction of unnecessary hospital stays.
- Easier integration of quality indicators such as readmissions and complications.

5. What tools will be used?

APR-DRG grouping software developed by Solventum.

6. What data is used to classify a patient into an APR-DRG?

The assignment is based on multiple factors from the hospital discharge, including the principal diagnosis, secondary diagnoses, procedures, age, sex, and discharge status of the patient.

7. Can secondary diagnoses affect the APR-DRG?

Yes, secondary diagnoses and chronic conditions can influence the severity level and risk of mortality, which in turn may change the APR-DRG category.
